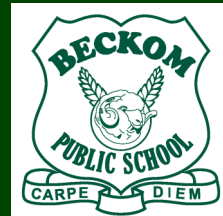

TRIVIA CORNER

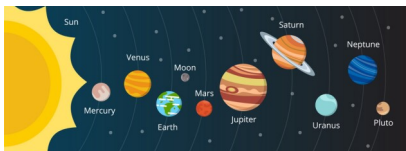

What is the national animal of Finland?

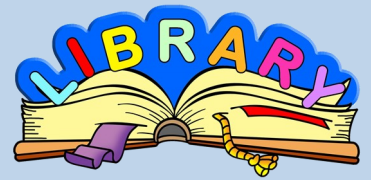
